Welcome to all of our new starters, and welcome back to everybody else – what a bright and sunny start to the new academic year it was! It has been wonderful seeing children back at school, and the buzz of learning in every single classroom has been amazing: well done everyone!

And we welcome several new members of staff to the team this September: Miss Brittain is our new Admin Apprentice in the front office; Mr Glenning joins us as a Teaching Assistant, supporting children across the whole school; Miss Davidson has moved from the kitchen to the playground as a Lunchtime Supervisor and Play Leader; Mrs Hayes has joined the kitchen team; and Mrs Brown and Miss Jacques continue to support children across school in their continuing role of Teaching Assistant.

You may have noticed two other new 'additions' to our school – the mannequins near the front office. These provide an example of what uniform should look like – both on a regular day and on a PE day. Thank you to all of our families who ensure children come to school in the right uniform each day, and thank you to those who have double checked with us about it. To clarify, PE kit is:

a plain white t shirt (small logos are acceptable, eg. a Nike tick on the chest or Adidas stripes on the arm cuff); black shorts/jogging bottoms/leggings;

sensible and appropriate footwear (plimsolls or trainers);

in the colder months children can simply put their school jumper over the top, or wear a plain black hoody.

This year our children in KS1 and KS2 will also have at least one half term of 'Forest Schools' led by Mrs Graham – please keep an eye out for a text message that lets you know when your child will also need to bring wellies and waterproofs into school!

I have also had several parents already ask about holidays during school time. Please can I direct your attention to our attendance policy – available on the school website – which states that 'holidays during term-time will not be authorised by the Head of School... All holidays requested will be referred to the CAP for a Fixed Penalty Notice'. Of course, there are sometimes exceptional circumstances for absences (such as a family emergency, hospital appointment or bereavement) however family holidays will not be authorised.
